


## Youth Sunday

**Future Plans:** Attending Saint Louis University as part of their Physical Therapy program and Diving on the swim/dive team


#### What does he appreciate most about St. Michael's?


High School: Barrington High School

Rebuilding Chicago Team Works Wonders

We send many thanks to the volunteers and donors who supported the Rebuilding Chicago project.. The day turned out great and Letty was beyond words of praise; she shared this thank you note: "*St. Michael's volunteers,* 

The Rodriguez family thanks you from the bottom of our hearts. We wish each one, along with your families, many, many blessings. Your hard work will never go unnoticed! The world is a better place because of people like you."

We were able to accomplish the following: paint the living room, dining room, and hallway. Replace the stair landing flooring and stair treads (thanks Steve!!), and structurally support floor joists. The union plumbers replaced a leaky toilet and shower valve and installed a laundry tub. The union electricians replaced 3 breakers, a few GFI outlets, 3 light fixtures and 2 ceiling fans. We also collected 3 boxes of home goods, toiletries, and cleaning supplies.

## CRISIS IN SUDAN, SOUTH SUDAN & RENK By Archbishop Joseph Garang Atem

Thank you for your love and prayers for your sisters and brothers in Sudan and South Sudan. The situation in Khartoum (capital of Sudan) is very bad. The fighting is going on up to now. It is making people flee from Khartoum to South Sudan, especially Renk Town, which is nearest to the border between the two countries. Since the fighting began, we received more than 45,000 in Renk Town and Paloch. It is difficult for Renk to manage that big number. It is creating big problems for all returnees, refugees and the host communities. Renk Diocese needs support of prayers and finances. Even a little will make a lot of difference because all are suffering from this unexpected crisis.
