

It was in response to a letter from the Anglican Archbishop Hosam Naoum, asking us to gather on that day and join with people around the world to pray. Thank you to all who came and prayed with us, and who joined us online, for I needed to spend some time in community and in prayer regarding this latest war that rages.

I invite you to pray for peace. I know that it can feel as though there is so little we can do right now, right here, to make a difference- so give that to God and ask God to work miracles of faith and love in the hearts of those who harbor hate and revenge. Here is the litany we used on Tuesday, should you want to pray it over the coming days:

God of Love, you created all people as one family and called us to live together in justice, harmony and peace.

Surround us with your love as we pray for the Holy Land.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer God of Righteousness, who demands that our worldly governors take up their responsibility to protect those in their charge and uphold the dignity of all human beings, pour your wisdom into the leaders of this world [especially Benjamin Netanyahu, the leaders of Hamas, and Joe Biden].

For all who bear such responsibility, that they may put the good of the whole over their own greed for power,

Lord, in your mercy, \Box Hear our prayer.

God of Compassion, who even in the darkest times, shows us your path: we give you thanks for all those who in the face of crisis wrought by evil-doers, work to help the helpless, to hold out hope to the desolate, to speak for the voiceless and to bring understanding and knowledge to a world darkened by ignorance and hate. For our siblings who risk much to aid others, that their actions may be successful and their words may be heard,

Lord, in your mercy,

 \Box Hear our prayer.

God of Mercy, who binds up the wounds of those who suffer, bless the victims of the consequences of fear and hate in the last week and over the past 75 years of conflict in the Holy Land: those injured and traumatized, those bereaved and grieving, those held as captives and prisoners, those who face deprivation and desperation because of systems of violence and oppression, so that they may move forward in this life standing firm in your truth and avoiding the temptation of vengeance.

For all whose lives are forever marked by suffering, that they may be blessed with the hope of your presence, Lord, in your mercy,□ Hear our prayer.

God of Life, whose faithfulness to us in never-ending, we remember before you those who have died by the violence that has become shockingly routine in your Holy Land; receive them into your heart where they may know the peace and joy of eternal life in you. For all who have died, that they may rest in that place where pain is no more, Lord, in your mercy,

God of Justice, who calls us to uphold the dignity of every human being, every child of this earth, beloved of you: empower your Church to help you heal this terrible cycle of violence and revenge; give us courage to rise above our fear that nothing can be done in the face of the conflict and chaos of our own creating; grant us the conviction to advocate for change and to work for the establishment of your peace, your shalom, your salaam, in this broken world.

For your dream of justice and peace on earth, and for us, that we may take up your call to build it, Lord, in your mercy, Hear our prayer.

All this we pray in the name of the One who offered his life so that we might live, Jesus the Christ. Amen.

FROM THE LIFT LEADER'S DESK

Do you want my real answer, or do you want the Sunday School answer? After I recovered from laughing, I told Jackson that, yes, I wanted the real answer, but I really appreciated that he was being honest.

Real questions and real answers are hard.

I then reiterated to the class how important it is that we keep it real. I want them to ask the real questions and give the real answers. How else will they grow into adulthood and adult faith?

Real questions and real answers **are** hard. As young people move away from the literal safety of some of those old bible stories, they have to transition into the cold hard reality that sometimes *there are just no simple answers*. We can no longer paint the picture in black and white. There are many shades of gray, with splatterings and splotches of black and white. That's where we have to teach them that no matter what their reality is, God is with them...No Matter What!

Two weeks ago, I shared a story with the LIFTers. The story was written by a mother about her 3-year-old who had climbed out of his crib one night and gotten into the bathroom. She was awakened by glass shattering and a scream. She rushed in to find her toddler OK but surrounded by broken glass and aftershave, with him excitedly repeating, "Where are the two Jimmys?" Of course, she saw no one.

Days later, when the mother was teaching Sunday School, she showed a poster of two male angels. Her son excitedly started telling the whole class, *Mommy! That's my two Jimmys!* He then told the little girl next to him how *the two Jimmys knocked Daddy's aftershave out of my hand. They didn't want me to drink it and get sick.*

I asked the LIFTers what they thought about the story. Clearly, these guardian angels had saved this boy's life. During the discussion, Henry slowly raised his hand... *Why doesn't God save all the children?*

I wanted real questions from this group, and I got one.

My fellow teachers and I grappled for explanations. I thanked Henry for his hard and honest question because I want to encourage these types of questions and never shut them down. The bottom line, Henry, is that **we just don't know why** one toddler gets saved and another one doesn't.

Theologians call it *The Problem of Evil*. Books have been written about why bad things happen to good people. I've told the LIFTers to *not* be like the many adults that I know who

have left God because they couldn't understand why a loving God would allow such suffering. (That's a long topic for Fr. Jesse.)

However, I DO know this: No matter the pain or the suffering, God is with us through it all, No Matter What! And that's...my **real** answer.

Foyers Sign-up Time is here!

Foyers is a wonderful opportunity for all members of St. Michael's, to engage in fellowship together. Foyers features 2 types of gatherings. The first type is adult Foyers and the second is family Foyers. Adult Foyers are typically 4 groups of couples/singles, that are all adults, that meet as a group in each other's homes for a simple meal, 4 times over a period of a year.
