From the Perspective of Deacon Tim --

The Barrington Area CROP Hunger Walk is planned for Sunday, October 15 at 1:00 p.m. I invite you to consider volunteering to recruit and coordinate St. Michael's parishioners. We are also asked to identify one or two parishioners to represent St. Michael's at one or two fall preparation meetings of similar congregational coordinators.

CROP Hunger Walks are sponsored by Church World Service. Over 2,000 communities nationwide participate in over 1,300 Walks each year. The work of Church World Service meets not only the needs of people with food insecurity, but also the needs of people suffering financial poverty, of refugees, and of people adversely affected by disasters nationally and internationally. Church World Service is rated 4-star on Charity Navigator.

Local agency beneficiaries of the Barrington Area CROP Hunger Walk include:

- * Northern Illinois Food Bank * Wauconda-Island Lake Food Pantry
- * FISH Food Pantry (Carpentersville) * BACOA Meals with Wheels

The children in our Sunday school have grown so much during this Lenten season. We continue to follow Jesus on his journey to the cross. We focus on the beautiful reminder that God provides for us and cares for us. In some of the lessons we learn that goodness can also be about truth and justice. We talk about how the Lord is my shepherd and how God's goodness and mercy are with us even when we face challenges. We reinforced how God is always present, giving us support and love.

On Palm Sunday we will be going through the stations of the cross. The children will also be singing. The Bridge group should meet in the choir room at 9:40am to rehearse clap your hands. The littles should meet in the Nave at 9:40am to rehearse with Doug. Then we will all head back to the community room at 9:50am for the Bells and Prelude. All children are welcome to walk together as a family outside around the church. When we enter back into church, I will gather the kids to go down into the undercroft for the Stations of the Cross lessons - kid style. Be sure to take a look at the Journey Thru Holy Week sign up genius below. We will have a children's activity on Good Friday that will include lunch. On Easter Sunday be sure to join us after the 11am service for the Easter Egg hunt. Wishing you all a happy Spring break!

In the past, I've had a wonderful corps of LIFT Reserves adults who have graciously said yes to my request to help out with LIFT on Sunday mornings. Those precious individuals (Bill Ferry, Lynn & Forest Mayberry, Greg Mears, Wes & Ann Kimes, Michelle & Kirk Chan, Caroline & Fred Hille, Samia Hefferan, and forgive me if I've left someone out) helped to give me assistance and keep us in compliance with the Episcopal Church's rules about keeping our children safe (having at least two adults present).

But this year, oh boy! Having consistent help has been such a blessing! I can travel to see my little grandson without guilt!

When Michelle taught recently, she told me that she was teaching the lesson on Jesus' transfiguration and how God had spoken out of the cloud that he was well-pleased with his son and to listen to him. Then Jesus told the three disciples to "Get Up..." She asked, "What would you do if Jesus asked you to get up and come here?" Jackson said, "I would Run to him."

Last Sunday, Mary Ann taught for me and used some lessons from the Living Compass Lenten guide on Compassion. Her text to me: When asked near the beginning of the lesson does anyone know what empathetic means, Sam said something like "It's understanding how the other person feels." Then Winston said, "It's putting yourself in someone else's shoes." I was floored & excited that not one, but two of them knew!

It is a joy and a privilege to teach young people. It is a huge responsibility that the LIFT team takes seriously, from teaching to planning activities for fun and service, to tracking our money. It truly *Takes a Village*. Thank you, Lord, for my wonderful village!

Prayer Shawl


Prayer Shawl will gather Thursday, March 30 from 10-11:30am in the library. All are welcome even if you just want to come and chat and eat coffee cake.

April 6


The Maundy Thursday service will be at 6:30PM.

April 9


Easter Sunday services will be at 9 AM and 11 AM.
