

I met this week with the new Fellowship Team, hoping to restart a ministry that will allow us to offer a small meal or reception for families when we host a funeral. I had twelve amazing volunteers respond to a quick email offering to help St. Michael's surround grieving families in love when they are burying a loved one. I am thankful to everyone who came and helped me think through our possibilities, and to Michelle Chan and Amy Hoff for agreeing to be the point people when such an opportunity comes. If you want to be a part of this group, to occasionally make food or help out in the community room during a reception, please email them or me.

On Saturday, I am proud to represent St. Michael's and the Diocese of Chicago at a bishop's consecration service in Ohio. The Rev. Anne Jolly will be consecrated and I have the honor of being a part of that service. I will bring your prayers and well-wishes, and be back to worship with you on Sunday.

And finally, I want to say a thank you to the pastoral care team who meets with me monthly and visits members of St. Michael's who are ill or who cannot attend regularly due to health. We are hoping to restart the Home Lay Eucharistic Visitors ministry again so that we can take communion to people who are not with us. We can train you right here at St. Michael's for this ministry (while pastoral care team is trained with Bishop Anderson House), so if you want to take communion to someone and make a difference in their spiritual lives, please let me know.


