A Note From Our Rector

Wars and rumors of wars... I will admit the news is harder to watch and read lately, with a constant feed announcing more war and violence in our world. Hamas and Israel this week, combined with the almost year and a half war between Ukraine and Russia, adds to the bloodshed and the worldwide fear of instability. Even across the globe and with oceans in between us, we too feel the anxiety and the worry. I am the first to admit that I understand very little of the politics and history that has led to these conflicts, and it seems impossible to reduce that history and these situations to simple, binary labels of villain/aggressor and victim/hero. Yet my heart goes out to the majority people living in these countries who have their lives turned upside down by the decisions of a few. I worry that, as it has been for thousands of years, the violence chosen today only plants the seeds for violence tomorrow. I remember a quote from Martin Luther King:

"The ultimate weakness of violence is that it is a descending spiral begetting the very thing it seeks to destroy, instead of diminishing evil, it multiplies it. Through violence you may murder the liar, but you cannot murder the lie, nor establish the truth. Through violence you may murder the hater, but you do not murder hate. In fact, violence merely increases hate. Returning violence for violence multiplies violence, adding deeper darkness to a night already devoid of stars. Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that." (Martin Luther King Jr. (1967). Where Do We Go from Here: Chaos or Community?. p. 67.)

As a follower of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, I invite your prayers that peace may dawn in our hearts and in our world soon. That both aggression and retaliation may cease. That along with God our creator and Redeemer, we may continue the good work of Peace and Justice once again. Good Lord, Hear us. Jesse+

Peace and Justice Announcement

As a Sanctuary Diocese we have resolved that our congregations and institutions would strive to serve as places of welcome, refuge, healing, and other forms of material and pastoral support for those targeted by hate due to immigration status or some perceived status of difference, and to work alongside our friends, families, and neighbors to ensure the dignity and human rights of all people. Please join in this "*Call to action*" so that we can provide our newly arriving brothers and sisters with the means by which they can live in the Chicago metro area with dignity and respect.

The situation has become very dire. This is a humanitarian crisis, with eight buses arriving every day the week of September 24. If anyone in our congregation has access to housing that they are willing to share with newly-arrived immigrants, please let Ellen Lindeen (peacellen123@gmail.com) or Father Jesse know. If you own an apartment building and one apartment is unoccupied, the Peace & Justice Committee would work to furnish it. If you have an apartment in your home that is not being used, would you share it? At this point we are looking for shelter for 3 to 6 months. If you feel called to this work and want to donate money instead, we could rent a place. Please consider helping in any way you can. Please pray. Please read the "Call to Action" and contact the leaders and representatives who are making
