A Note from our Sunday School Director

Last Sunday we discussed affirmations and how Jesus sees us as being those positive statements. Affirmations for children can play a crucial role in building their self-esteem.

These messages of I am amazing, or I am awesome are simple for kids to soak up. Positive phrases help counteract negative self-talk. It increases their self-worth and instills in them that they are capable and deserving of God's love.

One of my friends described my home as the home of words. It has become my art collection. I have different phrases, poems, prayers, and family values framed in every room. For me, these posted affirmations surround my environment with positive energy.

The children had so much fun making a list of affirmations from each letter in their name. I encourage you to continue this lesson at home. Practice them daily and make it fun! Here

are a few we came up with. I am loved, appreciated, unique, a good friend, I can learn anything I want, I am creative, I have skills and talents, I am confident, I do the right things, I listen to God's word, and I hold my head up high!

A Moment or Two by Fr. Jim Swarthout



God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him . . . " John 3: 14-21

The Word:

Too often, we approach faith as a series of "thou shalt nots" – religion is equated with guilt, spirituality with that nagging little conscience in the depths of our souls that serves as a safety valve to stop us from becoming the wicked people we know we are capable of becoming. Jesus challenges such a limited concept of faith: God is not a cosmic tyrant that revels in seeing us suffer; God has revealed himself as the loving Father of a perfect creation that has made itself imperfect in so many ways through sin.

Reflection Points:

In his late-night conversation with the Pharisee Nicodemus, Jesus presents a very different picture of God — and of ourselves. Jesus reveals to Nicodemus a God of life and restoration, a God who seeks not our punishment or humiliation but our healing and reconciliation with him and with one another. The God Jesus reveals is not the God of condemnation and destruction but the God of forgiveness, mercy and compassion. And that should help us re-imagine ourselves: that, created in God's love, we are more than the superficialities of appearance and assets, of wit and social graces. In the light of his Christ, we come to realize the good in ourselves that we often do not see; in that light, we find joy and reason to be grateful for the good that others bring to our lives. As Jesus explains to Nicodemus, God has created us as an extension of himself: from the moment of our creation, his life and love are part of our very being. In our embracing of his Spirit of justice and mercy, in our work to re-make our world in his dream of compassion and peace, the love in which we were created transforms our lives and the lives of those we love and who love us into the very light and love of God.

Choral Evensong March 10, 5pm





March 29 - Good Friday Service will be at 12 PM at St. Michael's and 7 PM at Salem United Methodist Church in Barrington.


March 30 - Easter Vigil, Holy Saturday Evening service will be at 8 PM.

Easter Sunday services will be at 9 AM and 11 AM.


We will be having an Easter egg hunt following the 11 AM service.

We are pleased that 87 people viewed our "Uncaged Art" Exhibit in the Community Room from February 14 to 25. We held a reception on February 18 with refreshments, music provided by Donna Brooks, coffee provided by Rosanna and Jack Shipley from Conscious Cup Coffee in Barrington, and guest speaker Jack Lloyd, member of the Diocesan Sanctuary Task Force, representative at Episcopal Migration Ministries' Asylum and Detention Ministry Network, Co-coordinator of the Province V Migration Ministry Network, Coordinator for the Court Watch program, in which volunteers attend and bear witness at immigration court hearings for migrants who are in detention, and a member at St. Martin's Episcopal Church in Chicago, spoke to us about his work with migrants.
