ALSO, FROM THE LIFT LEADER'S DESK

On a final note, I read an article the other day in my Apple Feed (I can't find it now) but it was talking about the negative aspects of excessive use of smart phones and teenagers. The news is not good. The preliminary data from an Adolescent Brain Cognitive Development study says that "increased screen time, including time spent on cell phones, is not just bad for the brain but can affect a child's psychology, thinking patterns, sleep cycles, and behavior, shortening their attention span," etc.... This dangerous trend is also feeding into kids' self-worth and self-image (especially in girls). They are losing the beautiful art of communicating.

A few Swords back, I wrote about how GenZ is not prepared for the workforce. Besides the obvious and terrible effects of the pandemic, over which they had no control, I believe this is the first (and oldest) generation to show the negative effects of too much time on screens and not enough time in person, communicating verbally with another person. "They couldn't make eye contact," was one example from a study. I, myself, have had to acknowledge that I'm checking my email and texts... all...day...long! When I'm without my phone (rarely) but if I (accidentally) left home without it when running a quick errand, I found myself jittery and nervous. Wow! Sound like an addiction?? I have finally been able to put my phone on *Do Not Disturb* for about an hour or so while trying to get something done without interruption. Again, I was anxious and jittery the first time I did it. Thankfully, it's getting a little easier.

Parents, unfortunately, you too, have to model some time "away from the phone." I know it's hard. Believe me! For the sake of our kids, they need downtime, e-free zones (which I enforce during LIFT) and just time to play and hangout.

And Parishioners, we too, have the responsibility of helping with this. Engage a young person when you're in their presence. Whenever a person is baptized, we repeat: "Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support *these persons in their* life in Christ?" We respond as one voice, *We will*. I believe *that* baptismal promise even extends to how we communicate with each other.

That's what I love about coming to church; yes, that old fashioned worship of coming together - to sit, be silent, pray, sing and listen. It's other-wordly these days. Where else can we do this? Bring your children and your teens for this special down-time that hopefully will result in blessed fruitfulness.

I preach to myself when I say, *Let us be mindful of our own behavior*. When you're in the presence of someone, look away from the phone and into the eyes of God's creation - another brother and sister. *Lord have mercy on us*. We need your help, always.

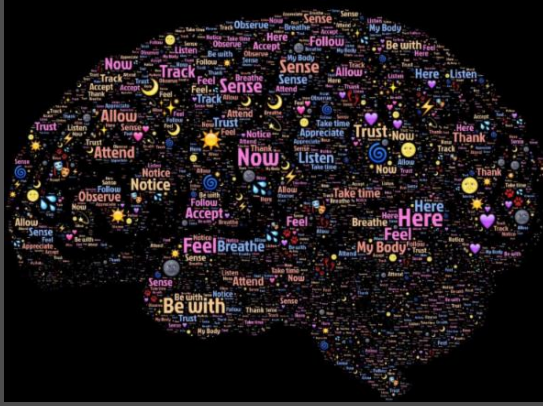

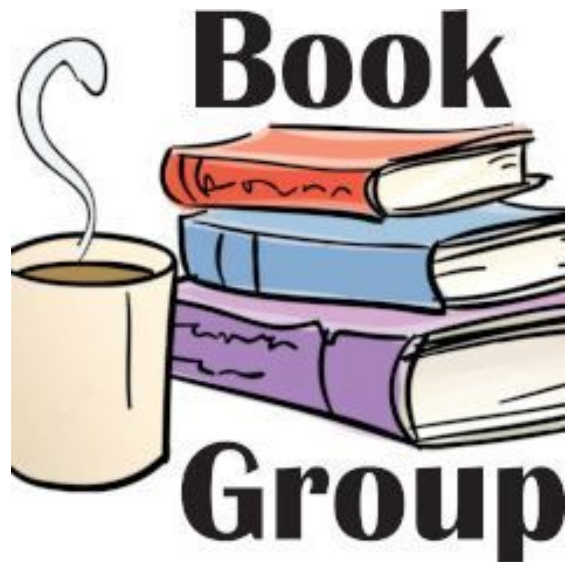

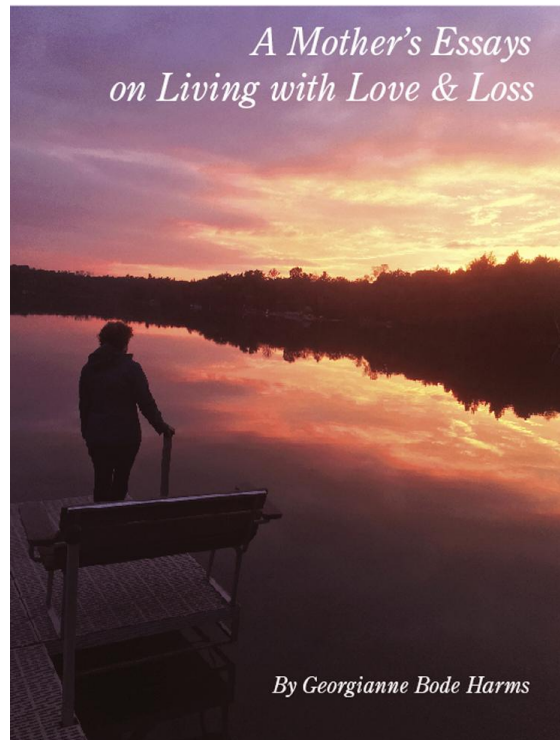
Heart Homes: A Mother's Essays on Living with Love and Loss Reception
